



This Acclamation is to be used when a proper verse is not sung. Acclamations with settings for the proper verse begin on page 17.









Gospel Acclamations Year A – July


July 3-9: Blessed are you, Lord of heaven and earth; you have revealed these things to infants. (Matthew 11:25)


July 10-16: The word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart. (Deutoronomy 30:14)

July 31 - August 6: One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God. (Matthew 4:4b)


August 7 - 13: I wait for you O Lord; in your word is my hope. (Psalm 130:4)


August 14 - 20: Jesus preached the good news of the kingdom and cured every sickness among the people. (Matthew 4:23)




September 4-10: In Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. (2 Corinthians 5:19)

September 18-24: Open our hearts, O Lord, to give heed to what is said by your Son. (Traditional)


September 25 - October 1: My sheep hear my voice, says the Lord; I know them and they follow me. (John 10:27)








GOSPEL ACCLAMATIONS YEAR C – JANUARY

Proper:
